Class Requests







Scripture 2017

As a teacher, it is always encouraging when students leave your class saying thank you. We found this with Scripture this year, that each week and especially the last week, many students coming up and thanking us and saying how much they loved it. On the last week, we asked for feedback and it was very positive. We asked them three questions, "What did you like about



scripture", "What did you learn from scripture", and "If you could summarise the main take away point, what would it be"? Students answered with a wide range of like, from singing, to memory verses, the stories, the games and many answered that they liked learning about God. To the question of what they learned they answered that God loves them all the time. This was also their main take away point of learning. What a great bunch of students!

This year we've learned about how God created the world and how He has given us responsibility to care for this world that we live in. We learned that because we as people made a big mistake we became separated from God, but don't worry, Jesus came to bring us back to God. We learnt of some miracles Jesus did to show that He was God, like calming the storm, healing the sick, raising the dead and most importantly, that He died for each of us before coming back to life again. Seasons for Growth grief and loss course is getting a very positive response from the students. Last week in Stage 1 we planted a seedling that should flower by the time we finish the course. The seedling



represents the growth that each student will experience through recognising and learning how to deal with emotions and feelings, especially associated with grief and loss. Each student has a plant to look after and watch grow. In Stage 2 we were looking at a whole range of feelings using emoji's and then linking these feelings with our body and how our body responds to different feelings.

It went out the next day to a family that needed some encouragement. This year we've cooked about 30 meals with only a handful left in the freezer. Which is healthier: Fresh, Frozen or Canned vegetables?

Buying your fresh vegetables in season means they are at their peak nutritional value and at their cheapest. It's important that they ARE fresh, though, because as the time they are stored increases, their nutrients decrease.

Frozen vegetables have their nutrients locked in by the freezing process shortly after gathering, so they are a good option: steam or microwave in a little water for best results.

Canned vegetables are a little less nutritious as the canning process affects heat sensitive vitamins EXCEPT for canned tomatoes where the antioxidants are made more available by the heat! Remember when using canned vegetables to get the low salt varieties. Whichever you use it's great that you're getting the important five serves a day for your family!
