School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS)

The SSTS has made some improvements to their system which now means that students who are progressing to year 3 and year <u>do not need</u> to reapply if they meet the following three conditions:

- They are continuing at the same school
- Are residing at the same address
- Have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport of NSW.

Their system has automatically validate a student's ongoing eligibility if they are attending the dame school and progressing to year 3 and year 7. Where a student met the eligibility the system has updated their entitlement and card. If the student didn't meet the new eligibility, they would have sent an expiry notification.

If you need to update any information or reapply for your child, you should go online to: https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails.

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2017 to ensure students' entitlement are updated and their current card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2017, the system will automatically cancel their card a new one will need to be issued.

trees. It was a joy for all of the staff to take this fantastic group of students out for the morning! Shireen Mostert











An extra big thank you to our fundraising machine Madonna and our jack of all trades Kris who will be leaving us this year. Best wishes to you and your families as you head off to high school.


SUSHITHIS FRIDAY!

The P&C meets about twice a term. Meetings last for about two hours.

President

This person is the face of the P&C. They chair the meetings and oversee the projects, ensuring decisions made are followed through.

Vice President x 2

Our two vice presidents are there to support the president and to step in as chair if the president is unavailable. They also take responsibility for driving our main fundraiser and in 2018 this is the Trivia Night and raffle.

Secretary

Together with the president, the secretary draws up the agenda for our meetings, takes the minutes and monitors the correspondence coming in and out. Occasionally they are asked to send out a letter on the P&C's behalf.

Treasurer

We have three accounts the treasurer looks after – canteen, uniform shop and one for all our other income and expenses. This person pays the bills (co-signed with one other executive member) and keeps us updated on how much money we can spend on school improvements.

Fundraising Co-ordinator

This role is perfect for someone who is good at organising and rallying people together. They lead a team of volunteers getting things ready for our mothers and father's day stalls, barbecues, school disco, raffle and other initiatives. They are only there as the point of contact to bring it all together – other P&C members will be there to help you in the lead up, and on the day.

Uniform Shop Co-ordinator

Ordering in stock as needed, passing on bills to the treasurer, training new volunteers and keeping the website up to date are the main responsibilities for the uniform shop co-ordinator.

General Member

Of course, a leadership position is not for everyone and many of our members are happy just to come along to stay informed and have a say in the decisions we make. They nominate what activities they would like to be involved in, if any, and are truly valued for their opinions and ideas. We welcome everyone. It's a great way to hear what the school has planned and how the P&C would like to support it. Whilst we encourage everyone to attend the meetings it is not essential, you can keep up to date via e-mail.
