Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 14th March 2019.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2020, you need to apply soon. You will need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address). Please contact the school if you are interested.

The application website is: <u>https://education.nsw.gov.au/selective-high-schoolsand-opportunity-classes/year-7</u>. Applications close on the 12th November 2018. You must apply before the closing date.



This term, Bilambil Public School has started the very exciting STEMShare Community program. This program provides kits of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) equipment for schools to trial for one term. The kits include enough equipment for classroom use and are supported with learning resources and training. The available kits include - Tablet Robotics, PC Robotics, 3D Printing, Virtual Reality, Filming and Coding.

We have been fortunate to gain access to the PC Robotics kit, which is designed for students to plug in devices to laptops, edit code online and create robotic solutions for a range of engaging challenges. Included with our PC Robotics kit is:

- PC Laptop x 10
- Makey Makey x 10
- Ozobot x 10
- Lego Mindstorm EV3 x 10
- Micro:bit with Grove Expansion pack x 10

The kit will mainly be used during K-6 library lessons with a robotics focus; however classrooms also have the opportunity to integrate it into other lessons.

Who knows... maybe one of our students will one day go on to become involved with the next robotic invention for our homes, just like the Roomba Robot Vacuum.

School Representation Policy – October 2018

Rationale: Representing Bilambil Public School is a privilege earned by our students who embody our school values – **Be Safe, Be Fair, Belong.**

Students demonstrate the importance of these values through their commitment to their education, attendance at school and their adherence to school policies and procedures. Fair, consistent and high expectations of students in relation to academic effort, personal presentation, attendance and behaviour ensure that every student in our school has the best chance of success.

Objectives: This policy is designed to:

• Reinforce positive expectations of students and particularly, commitment to the school's values;

• Ensure students are provided with every opportunity to achieve requirements for success in their academic studies; and

• Encourage students to find a balance between their academic studies and extra-curricular involvement.

School Representation includes any curricular or extra-curricular activity where the student represents the school. Examples include but are not limited to: student leadership, sport other than inter-school sport including representative sport, school camps and excursions, competitions and performances.

Extra-Curricular activities include any activity which is additional to the core curriculum being delivered. Examples include: special events in and out of school time, camps, school musicals and specialised excursions which do not relate to the direct delivery of curriculum programs.

Implementation: The opportunity to represent the school is conditional on meeting behaviour expectations in the classroom, playground and at external school related activities. Students who have made behavioural choices which impact negatively on theirs or other student's learning have not earned the privilege to participate in extra-curricular activities or school representation and thus may be excluded from representing the school. This will be judged on each event, but may last for the duration of the term. At the end of the term their representative status will be reinstated.

Students who fall into the following categories will be automatically ineligible to participate in extra- curricular activities or school representation:

- A warning on the receipt of the first RTA during a term and full consequences for a 2nd RTA, or
- Students who do not meet the minimum of 90% attendance (explained or unexplained) unless circumstances warrant an exemption.

In addition, the following conditions will apply to Stage Three students throughout Term Four each year:

- Receipt of a second RTA automatic ineligibility to participate in the Bounce Day.
- Receipt of a third RTA automatic ineligibility to participate in the Year 6 Big Day Out
- Receipt of a third RTA automatic ineligibility for Year 5 to nominate for any leadership position for the following year.
- Receipt of a fourth RTA automatic ineligibility to participate in the Year 6 Informal.

Parents/Carers should be informed if their child is not eligible for school representation however the final right of decision for school student representation will always rest with the principal.
