Help your child with shyness

Around the end of January, you and your children will begin preparing to return to school.

For most children this is a time of high excitement and energy. The long holidays are coming to an end and they are looking forward to seeing old friends, making new ones, and being a grade higher. But the excitement is often tinged with a hint of trepidation – “who will be in my class”, “will they still like me”, “what teachers will I get”? For some children, these worries can dominate their life.

The good news is parents can help their kids through it. When their child is scared, a loving parent can think of nothing more important than protecting them. But excessively protecting your child and taking over, doesn't allow them to learn through experience.

Alternatively, shy children can be taught to think more realistically about the things that worry them. “They will think I'm an idiot if I wear that” can be challenged by asking “what would you think of someone wearing it?” “Everyone is staring at me” can be challenged by getting the child to look around and count how many people are actually looking.

Shy children should also be challenged to gently and gradually face their fears. For example, for a young person who is scared to speak to others, they could be challenged to speak to one or two “safer” kids every day for the next week. Then they could be asked to speak to a couple of slightly “harder” kids every day the following week, and so on.

Finally, if you find that you, as a parent, have a tendency to jump in and regularly help your child, try to get into the habit of asking yourself, “what would happen if I held back for a few minutes?”

Babies and children in hot weather

Babies and children need to be watched carefully during hot weather carefully because they are at a higher risk of becoming unwell than adults.

Things to remember

- Babies and children overheat and dehydrate quickly in hot weather
- Offer older babies and children extra drinks in hot weather, the best drink is water
- Dress babies and children in cool clothing and protect them from the sun with hats and sunscreen
- Never leave children in the car, not even for a moment

How does hot weather affect my baby or child?

Hot weather can affect your baby or child because their bodies cannot adjust to changes in temperature as well as adults. Babies and children sweat less, reducing their bodies' ability to cool down, and they generate more heat during exercise than adults. They are at risk of overheating and developing a heat-related illness. Heat can also make existing illnesses worse.

Some ideas about food in hot weather

- A refreshing idea for young children is to freeze fruit pieces (orange quarters, watermelon).
- Give more frequent but smaller meals, offer chilled food items and minimise hot food.
