

KINDERGARTEN TRANSITION SESSIONS TO COMMENCE

Our first Kindergarten transition session is almost here. This will be held next Wednesday, 3 November commencing at 9.30am and running through to 12.30pm in our Kindergarten classrooms. Our Kindergarten Transition Program aims to ensure that our starting students next year will be prepared for 'big' school.

The transition program will involve the kids coming into our beautiful school for a 3 session half day program on Wednesday 3/10/17 November, 2021, from 9.30am – 12.30pm each session.

Parents are unfortunately unable to attend due to current restrictions, so are asked to deliver new students to our Kiss and Drop area where they will meet our smiling teachers who will escort them into each session. Participating students will only need to bring their morning tea and lunch, a drink bottle, and a hat.

The kids will get to experience all that school offers and get a chance to really familiarise themselves with how a school day runs and participate in a huge range of wonderful activities. This transition program is aimed to better prepare the kids for their start in Kindergarten in 2022, to alleviate any nerves and ensure they get the best start to their education. Information sessions for parents will have to be delivered virtually, with information to be sent home via email soon.

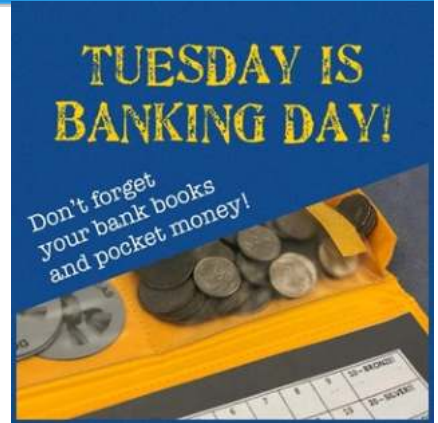


LAST CHANCE FOR BANKING
