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ADMIN OFFICE UPGRADE

Late last year, we received confirmation that we were successful in receiving a grant from the DoE to upgrade our office facilities. Last term, representatives from the DoE sat down to plan what work we might have done within the budget that we have been allocated. I am happy to say that Huck's Builders have been awarded the tender to conduct our works which will include:

- A new entry to the school office and a new front office layout.
- A new waiting area for visitors to the school in the front office.
- Reconfigured office spaces to provide a larger space for our key office personnel.
- A reconfigured staff room area to provide an administration office for school executive staff.

While we are very excited about the upgrade, it will obviously present with a number of logistical matters for us to function normally while work takes place in our front office area. This will result in our actual front office space being re-located to the staff room end of the administration building, so work can commence on our new entry and offices.

Work is to commence in 2-3 weeks, where builders will create the new Executive Staff office in our current staff room annex. Once work is complete, Sharyn, Lorraine, Kelly, and Vicki will move into this new space temporarily, for work to start on the rest of the job.

Access for parents and students will be clearly labelled with signs pointing in the direction to go to our new temporary office around builders fencing that will keep students, staff and community out of work spaces. While we are expecting some teething problems as we adjust to the office becoming a building site, we appreciate your support for any inconvenience experienced by our community during the 15 weeks that building works is expected to take. All work should hopefully be completed by the end of term 3.

LIBRARY FURNITURE UPGRADE

Our Library space will have an overdue upgrade as well, with new carpets, as well as new shelving and furniture being ordered in the coming weeks. We have participated in extensive planning to ensure we provide a welcoming and engaging library space that is functional for learning for students. We will look to have a reveal of our new library space when it has all been completed, which is expected to be early next term.

2020 ANNUAL REPORT AND 2021-2024 STRATEGIC IMPROVEMENT PLAN

School staff have recently completed work on our 2020 Annual Report, which is a reflection of activities that took place here at BPS last year. It is worth a read if you are interested to know where and how we allocated resources and the details of evaluations of specific activities. Our 2021-2024 Strategic Improvement Plan is the culmination of a deep look into our data sources through a rigorous self-assessment and situational analysis. Our identified strategic directions for the next 4 years are:

- 1. Growth and Attainment tied to improvement in curriculum implementation and growth and attainment of school results linked directly to school targets in reading, numeracy, attendance and wellbeing.
- 2. High Expectations and Collaboration tied to high expectations on improvement to teaching practice linked to current focus on high impact professional learning in numeracy with Number Talks and Instructional Rounds with Curriculum Advisor role, as well as the development of collaborative practices and feedback inside and beyond the school.

3. Wellbeing – supporting current focus around embedding a planned approach to wellbeing. These documents are available to be viewed by community on our school website. 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BREAD TAGS FOR WHEELCHAIRS

Bread Tags for Wheelchairs has been running in South Africa since 2006 - they collect bread tags which a local plastics company, Zibo, buys for a small amount per kilo. The tags (high impact polystyrene, type 6 plastic) are recycled, being made into seedling trays. The proceeds are used to provide wheelchairs for the needy. At present 500kg are collected per month in South Africa, funding 2-3 wheelchairs. A great environmental and social project!

Although some individuals and organisations had been collecting prior to this, in August 2018 we launched Aussie Bread Tags for Wheelchairs to start collecting bread tags in Australia on a national scale. Initially we sent all the tags back to South Africa with travellers and had some use of a charity container to get them there too. In February 2019 we found a recycler in Robe, SA, who was prepared to make a donation to us in exchange for tags on an ongoing basis, so now we are sending him regular shipments.

The funds are still used to buy wheelchairs for needy South Africans.

We have a constantly growing network of collection points around Australia, which you can see via our collection point map. If you would like to collect for us, you can drop your tags at one of these or contact us to make other arrangements. Even better, if you would like to host a collection point, your details will be published on our website so others can drop their tags off at your location.

Last Friday, Miss Tunsted delivered our piles and piles of bread tags to a local organisation named 'Recycled Mats' located in Tweed Heads. The owners were absolutely overjoyed with the magnitude of bread tags Bilambil have collected. The bread tags are re-used to become wheelchairs.

They are also asking for any unwanted blow-up plastic pool toys to be handed in as well. These can be handed to the front office.

Let's keep collecting those bread tags Bilambil!
