Regarding COVID-19 restrictions, regular updates have been provided to community through the SchoolStream app, and emailed home to families.

It is unfortunate that our experiences here at school are interrupted due to enforced guidelines and Department of Health directives, but they seem to be doing the job of keeping us all safe if everyone is doing their bit to stay COVID safe.

If you do not already have access to the SchoolStream app, I urge you to download it from your providers app store (it is free) and connect the app to our Bilambil PS page. Information is often provided weekly, and sometimes more frequently, for community members. We thank community for the support with all measures currently in place to help us manage the effect of COVID-19 here at school.

A reminder that if your child tests positive for COVID-19, or if a family member tests positive, your child will need to isolate at home for 7 days from notifications. All positive results should be registered on the Services NSW app, and a phone call to our school should be made to let us know your child will not be attending school. Information was sent home last week regarding support for students who will need to Learn from Home due to isolating. Please contact the school for any further information regarding any of this.

## **VIRTUAL MEET THE TEACHER SESSION**

Our 2022 Meet the Teacher session for families to connect with your children's 2022 teachers for all students in Years 1-6 will unfortunately need to be a virtual meeting via Zoom, to be held during week 6. All parents and carers will be invited to attend the virtual meeting from classroom teachers through Class Dojo or SeeSaw communications that have all been established.

Parents and carers are encouraged to join in on the zoom session for extra information about your child's class from their teacher. Each stage across the school will also be sending out a term overview this coming Friday alerting families to individual class requirements, support, and other relevant information.

Parents are, of course, very welcome to contact teachers through Dojo, SeeSaw, or through a phone call to the front office to arrange a face to face interview if there is pertinent information regarding your child for the teacher to know to ensure their success here at school.
