#### CODE OF CONDUCT FOR SCHOOL STUDENTS ON BUSES

We continue to be frustrated by some disappointing choices that a number of students are making when travelling on our school buses. It is every student's responsibility to behave in a manner that ensures the safety and comfort of all passengers and drivers. If your child catches a bus to or from school, can you please have a conversation with them to ensure they understand the following items:

Behaving appropriately:

- Respect the needs and comfort of passengers (eg use of offensive/racist language, fighting, spitting, feet on seats, throwing things in or from the bus, eating or drinking).
- Stay seated with seatbelts on at all times on the bus when stopped or moving.
- Obey reasonable directions from the driver (e.g. where to sit or to remain in the bus).
- Keep arms, legs and head inside the bus.
- Refrain from attracting the attention of the driver, except in the case of an emergency.

#### Respecting property:

- Protect bus property.
- Ensure that buses are not vandalised.
- Report any vandalism (eg graffiti and window etching).

#### ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS

The Home School Liaison Officer (HSLO) visits our school regularly to monitor the attendance of all students. It is a legal requirement that children of school compulsory age attend a registered place of instruction on each day it is provided. Term 4 will be a time when we aim to strengthen our processes for managing attendance and improve our overall data.

While sickness or family leave can be unavoidable, it is important to encourage regular attendance as this has positive effects for learning.

When your child is absent, it is a requirement that the parent/caregiver provide an explanation for the absences within seven days. This explanation can be by way of a telephone call, text response, or person to person (parent/caregiver or teacher). The explanation must give a justifiable reason for the absence.

We have also been reminded that parents have to provide a valid reason for late arrival or early departure from school, so we will be adding these to our text messaging that currently occurs. Parents and carers are asked to walk students into the school office if arriving late to provide a reason for late attendance.

#### **END AND START OF SCHOOL TERM DATES**

Term 3 ends next Friday 23 September, 2022. Community may have also heard that next Thursday, 22 September, 2022, is a public holiday due to the passing of the Queen. Students will then attend school for the last day of term on the Friday.

#### Students are to return for the commencement of Term 4 on Monday 10 October, 2022.

As we are about to commence a two week holiday break, can I wish all community members a safe and happy holiday period. For those travelling away, please drive carefully and ensure that you take a break if driving long distances. The holidays are always a good time for families to share time together so enjoy this time together. We look forward to seeing all of our smiling, happy little faces when they return to school for what will be a busy term 4.
